WILD WOOL BIRDS Craft at home

LET'S GET STARTED!

You will need to collect some twigs and a leaf for the finishing touches to your wild wool bird. So take this opportunity to get out and go for a winter walk in your local forest, park or even spend some time in your garden. Just remember to take only what you need!

Materials

- Buttons for eyes
- Wool 2/3 colours, 3 is best.
- Card or cardboard
- A5 piece of scrap paper
- 2 small twigs for the legs
- Leaf for the beak
- Scissors
- Glue or double sided tape



Cut 3 pieces of card. A– Back piece 14 cm B– Breast piece 10cm C– Wing piece 9cm



Take your wool and wrap 30 times around the card. If the wool is very thin you may need to wrap more, until it is roughly 2cm wide.

Hold the wool firmly and cut the wool from the card. Tie a piece of wool around the middle of group C.



Lay A down and place B across the middle to make a cross.



Set C across the middle where A and B meet. Crumple your A5 piece of paper into a ball and set on top. This will become the body of the bird.

Fold B over A and tie at the base. Make sure the ends are even.



Push the twig legs into place. Cut a diamond shape from the leaf and fold to make a beak. Then glue or stick on the beak, legs and button eyes.
