TCV has projects across the UK and offers a range of activities suitable for all levels of experience and fitness. We make it easy to volunteer with us and you can join in with our activities as little or as often as you wish.

Keeping you safe and equipped

We are committed to keeping you safe with us. You will be supported in our activities by a fully trained leader, receive safety briefings and the tools and protective clothing needed to do the job. We may also be able to signpost you to other organisations if you need support beyond our skills and experience.

We undertake lots of different activities in both urban and rural areas, from planting trees and wildflower meadows, to building stiles, clearing footpaths or creating new food growing projects.

Want to get more involved?

We have more involved volunteering rolesfor people who want to support our staff to run projects, or even to learn how to lead our work – great for those already experienced who want to share their skills or who want to grow their skills and confidence on a regular basis.

Volunteer Officers (VOs) and Key Volunteers (KVs) will receive support from a trained line manager to oversee their training and development.



Be a Volunteer Officer

You will learn to plan, organise and lead ongoing community or environmental projects with TCV. Volunteer Officers guide volunteers on practical projects and help them make the most of their experience.

A VO will have:

- A manager to oversee training & development.
- Genuine responsibility that helps build your vocational skills.



- A comprehensive training package including first aid, project leadership and safeguarding, plus access to our online learning system.
- Any other training identified locally for your role
- Travel expenses where budgets permit.
- TCV T-shirt & outer layer (hoodie/waterproof).
- Access to the Countryside Job Service search to look for jobs in this field.
- As this is a position of responsibility, you will
- require DBS and other safeguarding checks.

Be a Key Volunteer

Key volunteers provide valuable support to staff and VOs and help us run our ongoing environmental and community projects. This is not a leadership or supervisory role.

A KV will have:

- A manager to oversee training and development.
- Essential training includes Safeguarding and
- Risk Assessment plus access to TCV's online training system.
- Any other training identified locally for your role.
- Where budgets permit other training may beavailable to meet local needs.
- Travel expenses where budgets permit.
- TCV T-shirt. Some of our key volunteer roles may require DBS and other safeguarding checks.

- Inappropriate behaviour is challenged, not accepted.
- Regular and constructive feedback.
- Out of pocket expenses can be reimbursed where budgets permit.
- Your records will be kept in confidence.
- Any concerns you have about the behaviour of staff or volunteers can be raised with staff on the project or through our online feedback & complaints system.
- Feedback will be appreciated & listened to, helping us to make volunteer experiences even better.

What we expect from you

We aim to create a supportive environment and request that you do the following while with TCV:

Personal Welfare

- Complete a TCV Welfare Form with basic personal information to help us keep you safe.
- Let us know of any changes to your health or address & phone number. This helps us to look after you and let you know of any changes.
- Wear clothing & footwear suitable for work outdoors.
- Bring a packed lunch & water if on all day projects.

Health and safety of yourself and others

- Listen to safety briefings & follow leader instructions.
- Use tools safely and correctly as instructed.
- If you don't understand, or need support, please ask.
- Use of alcohol or drugs on site is not tolerated.

Treat all staff & volunteers with consideration

- Respect diversity, equality & confidentiality.
- Avoid inappropriate, suggestive or threatening language.
- Do not engage in any behaviour of a sexual nature directed towards others whilst volunteering
- Arrive for sessions on time & work to the timetable.
- Work together and share tools.

We will always endeavour to resolve concerns amicably. However, we cannot support volunteers who compromise the safety or inclusive nature of our groups, and anyone doing so may be asked to leave. I understand what is expected of me to help TCV maintain a safe and inclusive environment
