



The Conservation Volunteers is thrilled to announce a landmark achievement in our community tree planting initiative, I Dig Trees. Thanks to a groundswell of support and the dedication of thousands of incredible volunteers, this year we've surpassed 3.7 million trees planted across the UK, since the programme's inception in 2015.

This remarkable feat is transforming

neighbourhoods through the creation of over 3,000 pocket forests so far. These much-needed havens for wildlife and recreational spaces for people are not just great for improving local green spaces, but also contributing significantly to the fight against climate change and our ecological decline. But we are only part way through our journey together, with the continuing wonderful support of our partners and OVO, we are endeavouring to reach our ambitious goal of 5 million trees planted between 2015 - 2025, ensuring a greener, healthier future for UK communities. These trees now bring habitats for wildlife, improved health for our communities and contribute to global efforts to tackle climate and biodiversity crisis. Their far-reaching benefits will continue to enrich the lives of countless individuals for generations to come.

Our impact continues to grow. In 2023, we've engaged over 22,000 volunteers from more than 1,200 community groups, resulting in the planting of 659,000 trees! That's a huge contribution towards TCV's 5 million tree target by 2025.

From urban neighbourhoods to rural villages, we've had wonderful feedback. People are rolling up their sleeves to enhance their local greenspaces, boost biodiversity, and build climate resilience.

It's inspiring to see communities coming together and making a real difference in their local areas and contributing to a phenomenal nationwide picture of tree planting. And it's clear that they don't just plant trees but also foster a sense of community and a deeper connection to nature, both of which are intrinsic to TCV's mission of connecting people and green spaces to deliver lasting outcomes for both.

"We had a fantastic weekend! We were blown away by the number of volunteers that turned up. We estimate about 50-60 people, lots of kids and a scattering of dogs. As the sun shone the tea and coffee flowed and the wood burner was running to keep spirits up. We had a number of experienced tree planters who were more than happy to lend their knowledge as well as muscle.

The kids planted a few trees then turned their attention to jumping on hay bales and playing with dogs. The 950 trees were divided into 150m of new hedge, a woodland and an oak circle as the centrepiece. We put well rotted horse manure round the base of every tree and are in the process of applying a good layer of woodchip.

Thanks again for helping us make this happen, we really appreciate it and the effects will be felt for generations."
