Outdoor Learning with us

TCV believes that every child should have the opportunity to participate in regular, sustained and inspiring outdoor learning. Nature is amazing and our education sessions offer a taste of this for kids living in Haringey.

We offer engaging and fun outdoor learning for EYFS, Key stages I & 2.

Activities are usually designed around the National Curriculum. Sessions could include scavenger hunts, wildlife surveys, stories, songs, arts & crafts and team games, as well as pond dipping and minibeast hunts.

EYFS

With younger groups we focus on exploring, working together and having fun in nature! Children will use their senses to discover plants and animals through the seasons by observing colour, shape, pattern and texture.
